

San Diego County high schools have seen an increasing percentage of Latinx graduates over the past 5 years, with nearly half identifying as Latinx in 2019-20.




The number of 12<sup>th</sup> grade enrollments is projected to increase over the next two years, with subsequent declines through 2030-31.

Cuyamaca primarily drew students from El Cajon zip codes, which accounted for 38% of students who enrolled in Fall 2020. Over the past 5 years, overall student headcount has decreased by over 1,000, and the number of students enrolling from the Spring Valley (91977) zip code has disproportionately decreased.

The unemployment rate and number of individuals unemployed in San Diego County consistently declined from the end of the Great Recession in 2012 through 2019, before increasing dramatically in 2020 due in large part to the pandemic. In 2021, the unemployment rate and number unemployed decreased by almost half.




Figure 4. San Diego County Unemployment, 2012-2021
